Likewise, States are enacting laws to further spur innovation and strengthen the space economy. Such changes will drastically alter realities in space, whether or not the existing global governance structure for space activities is adequately prepared.

The Space Security Conference 2018 will examine the existing framework for space governance to see what aspects remain relevant to the emerging order in outer space, as well as what elements might be updated.
